# **PORT BRIEFS**100 Already? Aniversary of a Historic Milestone



Once Congress approved funding the dredging of a deepwater channel to link Houston with the Gulf of Mexico, Houston had to hold up its end of the bargain.

U. S. Representative Tom Ball's proposal for Houston to share the cost of the project with Congress had sealed the deal. It was time to pony up.

The voters approved the creation fo the Harris County Houston Ship Channel Navigation District and \$1.25 million in bonds to pay for the District's share of the channel. On April 24, 1911, the Navigation and Canal Commissioners of the District met. All three were present: Charles Dilingham, Ross Sterling and C.G. Pillot. They voted unanimously to have the bonds issued by Harris County

Commissioners Court on behalf of the District.

Now came the hard part: selling the bonds. According to Marilyn Sibley's history of the Port of Houston, "...they (the bonds) were indifferently received by the buying public. Most buyers had never heard of navigation bonds, and bankers and brokers hesitated to handle them because of the small commissions received and because the law provided they could not be sold for less than par and accrued interest."

Businessman and civic leader extraordinaire Jesse Holman Jones came to the rescue as he would throughout his productive life, earning him the nickname "Mr. Houston." Jones met with the presidents of the city's largest banks and asked them to take the bonds in proportion to their capital and surplus.

In less than 24 hours, Jones convinced the bankers to accept the bond. In one segment of Ball's history of the port printed in the Houston Chronicle on August 23, 1936, he reported, "The next morning Mr. Jones reported that every bank in the city would buy its share of bonds, which they did, and this 'trouble knot' was cut."

Once again, Houston's civic and business leaders showed that if they wanted something, they always found a way to get it done.
